On the 25 March 2021 The Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs confirmed with modifications The East Riding of Yorkshire Council (Goodmanham Restricted Byway No. 7 and Market Weighton Restricted Byway No. 12) Definitive Map and Statement Modification Order 2019 made under Section 53 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to modify the definitive map and statement for the area by adding a public footpath in the parish of Market Weighton some 400 metres in length commencing on Market Weighton Bridleway No. 14 at Grid Reference SE 8816 4221 (Point A on the Map) and leading north-easterly to Grid Reference SE 8837 4254 (Point B on the Map). The public footpath will have a width of 1.8 metres.

and

Adding a public footpath in the parish of Goodmanham some 710 metres in length commencing at Grid Reference SE 8837 4254 (Point B on the Map) and leading north-easterly to join Goodmanham Footpath No. 1 at Grid Reference SE 8868 4317 (Point C on the Map). The public footpath will have a width of 1.8 metres.

The Order comes into force on 21 April 2021 but if any person aggrieved by the Order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, under paragraph 12(1) of Schedule 15 to the Act within forty two (42) days from 21 April 2021, make an application to the High Court.
